Jeff Sessions is an American lawyer and politician who served as U.S. attorney general (2017–18) in the administration of Pres. Donald Trump. He previously represented Alabama in the U.S. Senate (1997–2017).



Sessions was born in Selma, Alabama, and currently lives with his wife, Mary Blackshear Session, in Mobile, Alabama. They enjoy spending time with their three children and ten grandchildren. After earning a bachelor's degree from Huntingdon College, he studied law at the University of Alabama (J.D., 1973). After law school, Sessions joined the U.S. Army Reserve (1973–86), rising to the rank of captain. He still considers that period to be one of the most rewarding chapters of his life.

Mr. Sessions' interest in the law led to a distinguished legal career, first as a practicing attorney in Russellville, Alabama, and then in Mobile. Following a two-year stint as Assistant United States Attorney for the Southern District of Alabama (1975-1977), Sessions was nominated by President Reagan in 1981 and confirmed by the Senate to serve as the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Alabama, a position he held for 12 years. Sessions was elected Alabama Attorney General in 1995, serving as the State's chief legal officer until 1996, when he entered the United States Senate. Mr. Sessions served as a United States Senator for Alabama from 1996 to 2016 where he focused his energies on maintaining a strong military, upholding the rule of law, limiting the role of government, and providing tax relief to stimulate economic growth and to empower Americans to keep more of their hardearned money. "From 2017 through 2018, Sessions served as the Attorney General of the United States."

Sessions says he was instilled with certain core values – honesty, hard work, belief in God and parental respect – that define him today.
